8	<p>Mailing Lists and General Data Protection Regulation GDPR</p> <p>From 25th May 2018 new European regulations came into effect in an effort to give individuals back control of their ‘personal data’ held by organisations.</p> <p>This effectively means that individuals have to ‘give their consent’ i.e. <u>Opt In</u> to mailing lists etc. [basically this means that you cannot be added by the person holding the list without proof that you requested to be added]</p> <p><i>In the Village the CDCA holds</i> lists of villagers, the list is kept by Alison ter Haar acterhaar@gmail.com</p> <p>1 Villagers who wish to be kept informed of village events. e.g. the 5 Villages Monthly Diary, and other emails that may be of interest.</p> <p>2 Parish Council Minutes List – villagers who wish to receive a copy, by email, of the Parish Council Meeting Minutes.</p> <p>Also within the village, a Neighbourhood Watch List, is kept by Sarah Wilson, sarahwilson@comptongardenflowers.co.uk this is for those who wish to be kept alerted to anything pertaining to household safety and community actions and information from BANES that is circulated.</p> <p>Oil Group – there is also an Oil Group in the valley, which is run by Martin Palmer, who lives in Burnett. Addendum – Alison forgot to mention that Jill Elliott has very kindly donated to the CDCA original conveyancing documents found in her attic relating to changes in the boundary line along the south side of Staddlestones in the 1960s when the land was being readied for building. Prior to that time there were 3 small cottages on that corner of Vicarage Lane, known as Terrells Cottages, owned in the late 1800s by Mary Weeks.
